
TBS Bonsai Library


Jan 2018 newsletter

I'd like to feature two of our new additions to the TBS library. Wayne Schoech has edited two Bonsai Today Master's Series books titled Junipers; Growing and Styling Juniper Bonsai, and Pines; Growing and Styling Japanese Black and White Pines. These are compilations of articles from Bonsai Today and Kindai Bonsai, directed at intermediate and advanced bonsai enthusiasts. As you would expect, each chapter (or individual article) deals with a specific issue, such as "Cultivating Balance; Energy Balancing and Needle Reduction" for pines, or "Developing Shari" for junipers. So while these books are not written as a complete step-by-step guide to bonsai, they do contain a treasure trove of information about pines and junipers. And the reader greatly benefits by having original Japanese material translated into English that makes sense, and we can all understand! I would highly recommend either/both of these books to any member who wants to be seriously involved with pines or junipers.
